## Happy Easter!

I can't believe it is now April and Easter is this weekend!

It feels like only yesterday that we were getting all excited about our Christmas services, but then hearing that we wouldn't be able to meet up with our families and heading into lock-down again for several months. It's been such a roller-coaster this last year, and I'm not sure the ride is over yet!

But as we come to the Easter weekend, and as we remember all that Jesus has done for us, I've been reminded that this life is not all there is. It is easy to approach Easter thinking about what Jesus did for *me*, and thinking about how that affects me *now*, but it is much harder to look at the enormity and the eternal nature of all that took place on that first Easter weekend. When Jesus said in the garden "Yet not my will but yours be done", he is recognising that God's plan and purpose was much greater than even himself. When Jesus died on the cross, and when he was raised to life 3 days later, he was defeating death, he was saving mankind, past, present and future. He was making a way for us to live with him forever, for there to be a new heaven and a new earth.

This life is not all there is - there is so much more than this pain and grief and suffering that we are going through now, and Easter gives us the hope to believe that, to hold on, to live for eternity, not just for now. What a hope we have to share!
