That's service.

And it feels especially hard when your own needs are as great, if not greater, than those you are serving.

That's one reason why so many Christian people feel tired right now. They are not the only people who feel this way, by a long way. Across the UK is a huge swathe of people who have stepped up to the front line day after day so the rest of us could live more safely and comfortably.

Covid asks followers of Jesus to keep on giving out even though they feel the same anxiety, experience the same privation and suffer the same illness as everyone else.

I want to express my gratitude to, and admiration of, the churches of Rochester Diocese. Despite the worry and the uncertainty of 2021, you have stepped up to your own front line without flinching. And across our communities are many whose lives have been enriched by that commitment; and many actions that will find their place in the coming kingdom."

So thank you to all of you who have served, whether that is in church, through the community larder, in your jobs and communities day to day, in your families. Thank you for making other people's lives better, for giving of yourself even when it has taken courage and more energy than you feel you have.

May we all find some rest and peace this Christmas time.
