How are you in this week of changes and new restrictions being brought in?

In this time that already feels busy and can be stressful, and with the added anxiety of Covid cases going up again, it's really hard to find time to stop and listen to God and to feel his Holy Spirit working in us.

Last week, I was picking Zara up from school and I saw a young person I knew standing on their own. That wasn't unusual. Zara got in the car and I was about to drive off when I really felt like I should ask if they were alright. It turns out they needed to meet someone, but they had not found them and their phone was dead, so they didn't really know what to do.

I was able to help and we found the other person after some phone calls, but it really reminded me that God prompts us all the time - but do we listen or obey?

I was also reminded that God can put us in the right place at the right time - I would usually not have been able to park where I did, but that day I could. God can orchestrate our lives to enable us to help others, but we need to be open to hearing and obeying that nudge from him.

God, in all the busy-ness of this Christmas time, would you help us to stay open to you, close to you, and in tune with you. Amen.

Mask wearing in church - as I'm sure you will have seen, the government are now bringing in Plan B of Covid restrictions to help slow the spread of the new variant. One of the parts of Plan B is compulsory mask wearing in most indoor settings, and that includes places of worship. - take a lateral flow test before you come to something at church and only still attend if it is negative

- keep on sanitising our hands regularly
