St. Matt's Midweek Update – 27th January 2023

How has your week been? I don't know about you, but I find this time of year really hard. January goes on forever, it's dark and cold and I feel tired and worn down.

I really didn't know what to write this morning, but I know that there are lots of us who are feeling far from God, or doubting where He is in all the mess and trouble we see around us, or just not feeling the enthusiasm for our faith which we once felt.

I've been trying to get back to reading the Lectio365 app daily readings, and this morning I read the one from yesterday. It was about Jesus appearing to his disciples on the mountain after he had been raised from the dead and giving them the commission to go and make disciples of all nations. But there was one verse that really struck me from the passage, which I hadn't noticed before.

Matthew 28:17 says, "When they saw him (Jesus), they worshipped him; but some doubted."

That verse really jumped out at me. The disciples had followed Jesus for 3 years and learnt from him, they had watched him die, and now they had seen him alive again. They were probably feeling all sorts of emotions and may well have been worn out by it all. Even after all that time with Jesus, some of them had doubts, but they still did a couple of things which I think we can take for ourselves. They still showed up on the mountain to see Jesus, and they still worshipped him.

You may be in a place where you can't even think about doing those things, but I really believe that God just wants us to show up. Sometimes all we can do is to say "God I need you" or "God where are you in all this" or even "I can't do this any more God", but that is enough. In reaching out to Him in the smallest of ways, we are showing up.

I also think that there is something powerful in worship, even when we feel far away from God or when we are doubting whether He is there. It's another way of showing up. We don't have to feel anything amazing or hear from God through it, but by worshiping we are acknowledging God and who He is.

The other encouragement I got from the passage, was that Jesus didn't just commission those disciples who were on fire for him, he commissioned all eleven, even the ones who were doubting. God loves all of us, whatever place we are in right now. He can use us whatever place we are in, and he will never give up on us.

"And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age." Matthew 28:20.
