I hope you have had a good week.

This week something happened that warmed my heart but also made me realise that we have to take the opportunities that God gives us to talk about Him. I am generally a reserved person, and I really struggle to talk about God to people outside of church.

But this week when I was at the choir I go to, the leader said we were going to learn a new warm up song. She started to read out the lyrics, so people could write them down or memorise them, and it was this...

'Better is one day in your courts,

better is one day in your house,

better is one day in your courts,

than thousands elsewhere.'

You might recognise this, either from the worship song or straight from the Bible (Psalm 84:10)! I commented to the person next to me that we sing this in church (although all the parts we then started learning are not what we sing in church!!).

But then a few others around me were saying that the lyrics made no sense and so I was able to explain that it was about God and about being in His presence.

It also felt lovely to be singing a song about God in a soul choir!

I don't know what impression the few words I spoke to them about God would have made, but I just hope that understanding the lyrics and singing about God might have some deep impact on their souls. That a small seed would have been sown. Worship music can be really powerful, so I pray God would use that as we sing this song over the next few weeks.

And that's all we can do, but also what we must do - take those opportunities to sow small seeds, to let people know that God is real, that being in His presence is amazing, and that He loves them.
