

## St. Matt's Midweek Update – 12<sup>th</sup> May 2023

I hope you have had a good week.

This week I have been touched by small acts of kindness from people - things like a little bunch of flowers on my desk, messages from friends who are regularly checking in with me, a meal cooked for Zara and I, and offers of help if it is needed.

And often these have been from people who are going through their own tough situations at the moment.

It reminded me that the Bible tells us so many times to love one another.

John 13:34-35 says "A new command I give you: love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this everyone will know you are my disciples, if you love one another."

Loving one another as God has loved us means loving everyone around us, not just those who we like or get along with. Jesus often associated with the outcasts and the 'unlovable'. He also told us to love our enemies!

It means loving people as they are, with all their struggles and mess. It means loving people on a daily basis, even when we don't feel like loving them. Because that is how people will see God through us.

Other verses in the Bible that talk about loving each other talk about kindness, forgiveness, freedom, humility, love covering a multitude of sin, love in action, truth, service. There are so many ways that love can be shown and expressed.

The other thing about the verse from John above is that loving one another is a command that Jesus gave. It isn't something we only have to do when we have some spare time, or something that only some of us need to do. It's not that just some of us need to be great at loving others, and some of us can just receive all the acts of love. We are all commanded to love one another.

I don't think that means we should forget our own needs and only ever think about others. I'm also not suggesting that we have the capacity to love everyone all the time. But I think we can learn to live a life of love - to show love in everything we do, by being kind and humble, by seeing others and what they are going through, by giving and sharing. But also to love ourselves at the same time.

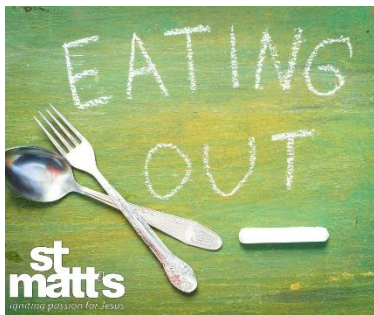
