This week I have been reminded that we can worship God in all we do, and in the everyday routines of our lives.

It's not always easy to spend time with God as much as we would like to, especially finding the time and space to stop everything else and have a 'quiet time'.

That's not to say we shouldn't try, but I also don't think we should feel bad if it doesn't happen for whatever reason.

But that doesn't mean we can't find ways to worship God each day.

I love worship music, and I don't listen to it enough, but this week we have been playing some worship music to mum, and I put some on in the office when I was on my own. It really lifted my spirits and made me feel at peace. Music touches our souls, and worship music is a great way of refocusing on God and giving Him the praise He deserves.

There are lots of other ways we can worship God as well in our everyday lives. Using times when we are outside in nature anyway to focus on God and be grateful for all He has given us, maybe when you are walking to work or walking the dog.

We can use everyday things to remind us to pray for people, maybe as we pass someone's house or at certain times in the day. Using times when we are doing another mundane task but we can focus on God, like washing up or having a shower!

It is also good to hang onto Bible verses and keep them with us for a day or a week at a time, like Mark talked about on Sunday. Have a Bible verse on your desk, or in your wallet, or on the fridge, so that you see it regularly and can let it sink into your heart.

There is a little book I used to have, called Practicing the Presence of God' by Brother Lawrence. I used to have a copy, but I think I lent it to someone! It is worth a read if you can get hold of a copy - it's all about learning how to get closer to God in everything we do, even in the mundane and the ordinary, worshipping God in all we do.
