How has your week been?

This weekend is Remembrance Sunday, and I have been thinking again about why the poppy is the symbol of Remembrance.



I'm sure you know that it comes from the First World War, when Lieutenant Colonel John McCrae wrote his famous poem 'In Flanders Fields', after seeing poppies growing up in fields that had been ravaged by war.

The places where the poppies grew had seen war and death, and were just wastelands of mud, and yet from beneath the ground, beautiful flowers appeared to give hope and life again.

We see similar in nature every year - plants die, gardens look like nothing can grow or be alive, and then in spring new life appears from beneath the ground.

What an amazing picture of our lives with Jesus! It doesn't matter how dead or dry or barren we feel, or how far away from God we feel, there is still hope. God is still working in our lives, beneath the surface, planting seeds or even just letting things lie dormant for a while. But all is not dead. When the time is right and with a bit of watering and nurturing, new life will come. That might be in this life, but it will definitely be in the next, so don't despair. Have hope.

And this weekend, as we remember all those who have gone before us and who have sacrificed their lives for us, let's be thankful for the life God has given us and put our trust in the eternal hope we have in Him.
