We really hope you can join us for some or all of our Christmas services this year! And please do invite your friends, family, neighbours, colleagues to come along and see what St. Matt's is like at Christmas!

Nativity - we're kicking off with our nativity service this Sunday at 10am. We have narrators and Mary and Joseph lined up, but the rest of the parts are up for grabs on the day and no rehearsal is needed! So if you have children who would like to be involved, they can either come in a costume of their own from home, or we have costumes available at church for them to put on before the service. There will be coffee served before and after the service as usual.

Then at 7pm this Sunday we have **Christmas Carols**, which is a beautiful service where you can hear our amazing choir and hand bell players, sing some carols, listen to readings telling the Christmas story, and enjoy drinks and mince pies afterwards.

There will be a hand bells practice for the carol service straight after the service on Sunday morning for those involved.

The following weekend, on Christmas Eve (which is a Sunday this year), we have...

A Reflective Christmas at 10am. Because Christmas Eve is a Sunday, we want to provide a service that is quieter and more reflective, for those who wouldn't come to Christingle or to Midnight Communion but would like a Sunday service. Maybe you find Christmas a difficult time, or maybe you just prefer peace and calm to all the busyness and festivities. You are very welcome to join us. Please note, there won't be any provision for children at this service, but refreshments will be served before and after.

Christingle Service at 4pm is great for children and families and is a lovely short service on Christmas Eve afternoon that gets you in the festive spirit. There will be some carols, a story about Jesus, and time to make your own Christingle with an orange and some sweets!

Midnight Communion is a reflective service with holy communion and Christmas carols to welcome in Christmas Day. It starts at 11.15pm on Christmas Eve and finishes soon after midnight.

Then finally on **Christmas Day** we have our **Family Christmas Celebration**. This is at 10am and will be fun and festive with carols, a short talk, and a chance to see what presents you've received!
