I don't know if you have watched the BBC drama "Mr Bates vs The Post Office"? If you haven't, I'm sure you will have seen the repercussions of it in the news. It will hopefully lead to those post office workers who were convicted getting their convictions overturned, and all those affected getting the compensation they deserve.

The BBC drama was really well done and gave so much insight into the years of distress and pain that was caused to so many. One of the things that really stood out in it to me, was that each post office worker who phoned the helpline to report discrepancies in the computer system, was told that they were the only one having problems. They were facing losses of thousands of pounds which they were being told they had to cover from their own money and were being told that they were all alone. The helpline wasn't helping them, the post office wasn't helping them, and they were being told they were the only one it was happening to.

And then Mr Bates started realising he couldn't be the only one, and worked tirelessly to get those affected together, and they worked collectively to try and bring justice and truth. But more than all of that, they gave each other the support they needed to get through it all. They were no longer alone - they were part of something bigger.

As human beings, we were not made to be alone. Even when we are not going through crises, we still need the support of others, and to feel like we belong to a community of people who are there to support us.

It reminded me of how unique and valuable our church family is in that way. In a world where we are increasingly told to be strong and to cope on our own, the church is an extended family who are all there to offer support and love when it is needed.

So this January, when it can feel really hard to venture out or to reach out, remember that your church family is there for you, and there are so many ways you can be part of that family. Sunday services, the community hub, the larder, toddler group, hubs, volunteering on a team. You belong to this family, and you are not alone.

The community larder is open every week on Fridays 9.30am - 10.45am.

The main aim of it now is to offer cheap food to those who need it, however part of the way the larder works means that there is also a huge impact in terms of saving food from going to waste. Fareshare have sent the larder their impact from 2023 - **the St. Matt's**

Community Larder redistributed 13.28 tonnes of food and drink in 2023, which is the equivalent of 31,630 meals for people who really need it. And that is just from Fareshare. The amount of food given from supermarkets will add to that as well. That is amazing!

Also, just a note to say that each Friday, the larder puts any **bread that is left outside the Bethel Hall** for people to take through the afternoon. Please feel free to pop by and take bread, or let people know who would find it useful.
