st matt's igniting passion for Jesus

This morning as I sat eating my breakfast, my orchid caught my eye. It has two lovely flowers on it and several more waiting to open. And I remembered that several months ago I had thought that it was dead, because it didn't even have a stem that looked like it was alive!!

I have had this plant for quite a few years now, and most summers I look at it and think it has had it, and that there is no way it will produce any more stems or flowers. And then, miraculously, a green shoot appears, and it slowly turns into a stem with buds on.

I then got to work this morning and opened the plan for the children's group for this Sunday so I could print it out, and it is about Jesus healing Jairus' daughter. You will remember in the story that Jairus is going to get Jesus because his daughter is ill, but before Jesus can go with him, he is told that his daughter has died.

When Jesus gets to the girl (and note that he still goes with Jairus) he says to all those around her, "Why all this confusion? Why are you crying? The child is not dead—she is only sleeping!" (Mark 5:39)



The thing that I feel God is saying to us today is that, even if things in our lives or in our church or in our communities look dead, actually they may only be sleeping, and God can bring them back to life and to fullness in His time. It is too easy to lose hope in things because they are not going the way we want them to or because they don't look like they used to.

Just like my orchid, and just like Jairus' daughter, we see things from our narrow human perspective and assume that there is no hope and no new life to be found. But Jesus does not see things from man's perspective; he sees them from God's perspective, and he can work miracles in the most ordinary places. He can bring the dead back to life, and he can be working in the deepest darkest places that we don't see. We just need to trust and have hope, and I pray that you would be able to do that today.
