Baptism is a way of showing that we are leaving our old life behind, dying to the wrong and sin in our lives, and being washed clean by Jesus, becoming a new creation.

When Jesus was baptised, He came up out of the water and God spoke words to Him which he also wants to speak to each one of us...

"As soon as Jesus was baptised, he went up out of the water. At that moment heaven was opened, and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and alighting on him. And a voice from heaven said, "This is my Son, whom I love; with him I am well pleased."" (Matthew 3:16-17)

I pray that those who got baptised on Easter Sunday will know and feel that same affirmation from God that Jesus got – that they are loved and that God values them.

And I also pray the same for those of us who have been Christians for a while, who got baptised a long time ago, that we would feel a fresh sense of those words from God over us this week. We are God's children and we are enough – God loves us and is pleased with us.

Annual Church Meeting and Electoral Roll

It's the time of year when we have our annual church meeting and update our electoral roll. Our annual church meeting will be on **Monday 13th May at 8pm** in church and everyone is welcome to come and hear updates about the year that has just gone, our finances, and to elect church wardens and PCC members. **Electoral roll -** We are now in the period before our annual church meeting (APCM) when the electoral roll is revised, adding on any new members and taking off those who are no longer eligible to be on it. The electoral roll is like a membership of the church - it's a Church of England thing and it allows you to vote in meetings and to stand for roles like PCC or church warden. The electoral roll will close on 25th April until after the APCM, so if you would like to join, please get your form to me before then.

Unlock sponsored walk – Saturday 27th April

In the past, St Matts has had walkers every year doing this sponsored walk around various parts of London, visiting all manner of churches which are linked with Unlock.

Unlock is a charity founded in 1972 which aims to encourage and support Christians in all manner of city environments and churches, training, resourcing and employing some workers.

The sponsored walk is in its 41st year and usually raises £20-30K, which is the bulk of the charity's annual income. They do an amazing amount with such a relatively small amount of money.


The walk this year is round Kensington, Hammersmith, Chelsea, and Fulham, passing Wormwood Scrubs, White City, the Notting Hill carnival area, as well as Grenfell Tower.

The walk consists of visiting 7 churches, all of different types...some big cathedral type buildings and others run down old buildings ..., and of different denominations. All of them will be able to share the work they are doing in their local community. It's usually totally fascinating seeing the amazing work brave, determined, small faith communities are doing.

The walk takes up most of the day. We usually meet at High Brooms station and go together, with a picnic, or you could drive to the start otherwise. Ideally you need to try to get some sponsors. It is a hugely worthwhile cause and a great experience as well.
