Today I thought I would look up the verse of the day on the Bible app I use, and it's a good one! Proverbs 3:5-6...

"Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways submit to him, and he will make your paths straight."

This is a very well known verse, but also a great chapter to read in full. It's good to be reminded that we don't need to try and work things out for ourselves or try to solve every problem we have with our own limited understanding. God wants us to trust Him, and sometimes that means just surrendering to the knowledge that He knows best and has a much bigger plan that we can see or imagine. That is part of trust - letting God take control even when we don't know what His path for us will be.

But what we do know, because this Proverb tells us, is that trusting in God and seeking His ways will bring us peace and prosperity, will bring us favour with God, will take us on the straight paths, will keep us safe and will bring blessing to ourselves and those around us.

That sounds like the kind of life I want, so today let's surrender our lives and our bodies back to God and remember that He knows best for us and He wants the best for our lives.
