St. Matt's Midweek Update - 3rd May 2024

How has your week been?



This morning I listened to the Lectio 365 app and it was about the Holy Spirit being like fire. The passage was from Acts, where Peter is preaching to the people in Jerusalem. The disciples have all been filled with the Holy Spirit in the upper room, and they are emboldened to tell everyone about Jesus.

Peter quotes from the book of Joel in the Old Testament:

"And afterward, I will pour out my Spirit on all people.

Your sons and daughters will prophesy, your old men will dream dreams, your young men will see visions." Joel 2:28.

It got me thinking, how easy it is to go through life just accepting the mundane and the normal, and forgetting the enormity of what God has for us and wants for us. God left us his Holy Spirit and he wants us to be tuned into Him and seeing the outworking of that.

But so often it feels like we are going through the motions of church and life, and not seeing those things that we know the Holy Spirit can do through us - prophecies, dreams, healing, speaking words of knowledge to people, praying over people, getting pictures.

Earlier in that Joel passage, it talks about returning to God, for he is a gracious and compassionate God. I wonder if we need to shake ourselves up now and again, and not just settle for the mundane, but turn back to God and ask Him to fill us again with that fire, and to use us through His Holy Spirit like He used those first disciples.

The yielding prayer in Lectio 365 says this:

"Lord, I yield to the burning, cleansing, empowering fire of Your Spirit today. Come Holy Spirit, let Your fire burn in me."

Will you pray that prayer today, and be expectant for what God can do in your life?
