Well done for making it to the end of term if you've got children at school or you work in education! Praying you can rest and recharge over the next two weeks.

I'm just sending out notices today - not feeling very inspired, sorry!!

#### **Notices**

Our services are not following the normal pattern over the next few weeks, so I've listed them out for the next month so you know what is happening!



**This Sunday (6th April)** is the first Sunday of the month, so we have our 8am communion service.

However at 10am we are not having another family service - we will be having a normal service with groups for children and young people. Chris will be speaking to us on 'Words that have shaped us'.

**Next Sunday (13th April)** is Palm Sunday and we have our 10am service and 5pm service. At 10am, there will be groups for children and young people and Chris will be speaking about Palm Sunday.

Trevor will be speaking at our 5pm service, with Chris leading the service and communion.

#### We are then into Easter week...

Thursday 17th April 8pm - Maundy Thursday Tenebrae service - this is a quiet reflective service with communion

Friday 18th April 10am - Good Friday Family Worship - a more subdued and reflective family service

Sunday 20th April 10am - Easter Sunday Family Celebration - a joyful celebration with baptisms and communion

**Sunday 27th April is Chris and Carole's leaving service** with food and drinks afterwards so people can stay around and chat over lunch. There won't be any groups for children and young people so that everyone can be in church together. We will have things for children to do during the service in their seats, but you may want to bring some extra bits. It will be very busy, so there won't be space to have toys out.

**Sunday 4th May APCM** - this won't be a family service, as we'll have had two on the previous Sundays. We are going to have our annual meeting in the service on the 4th May. We will spend some time looking back and celebrating all we do as a church, and also looking forward as we start our time without a vicar. Children and young people will go out to groups during the service. **PCC nominations** - At our annual meeting we elect PCC members (these are the trustees of the charity who deal with governance of the church). If you are interested in joining the PCC, please do come and talk to Brian or myself about it over the next few weeks. We can tell you what is involved.



**Easter opening of the Larder** - the larder is still open all through the holidays, but just a reminder that the larder will be opening on Easter Saturday, instead of on Good Friday that week. **Easter break** - It's now the Easter holidays, so all our midweek groups and activities have stopped for two weeks. Everything will start back up from Tuesday 22nd April.
