Last Sunday Mark introduced our new sermon series on Joseph. He gave us a bit of background about Joseph's family and where they had come from.

Joseph was Abraham's great grandson. We know that Abraham was told by God that he would be the father of many nations, and God made a covenant with Abraham, that his family would be God's chosen people and He would lead them to the promised land.

Joseph is only 3 generations on from that covenant, but already in this chosen family we have seen a lack of trust, taking matters of having children into their own hands, lies, incest, banishment, deception, stealing blessings and more! They were far from perfect.

And yet we see that God still meets with them, He still blesses them and works through them. They are still God's chosen people, even though they get it wrong over and over again.

What a relief this is for us! We can go to the Bible thinking all the people God used over history must have been good and holy, but they are not at all! They are just like us, and like all humans before and after us. We all get things wrong, we all mess up, but God can still use us and we are still chosen by God.

As it says it 1 Peter 2:9:

"But you are a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's special possession, that you may declare the praises of him who called you out of darkness into his wonderful light."




This summer some of us from St. Matt's are going to New Wine. New Wine is a festival with worship,
