This week I have been trying to listen to the Lectio 365 app in the mornings, and it has been all about the first followers of Jesus and the early church in Acts 2:42-47. This follows on from Pentecost in the Bible.

If you read this short passage in Acts, it tells us what was important to the early church, and therefore I think what should be important to us as church now. There are 4 things they devoted themselves to - teaching, fellowship, breaking of bread (communion) and praying.

Thank you so much to everyone who came to our prayer meeting on Wednesday evening. This is a great time to be thinking about who we are as a church, and I was reminded as we prayed that we need to be preparing ourselves as a church for the future, as much as we are asking God to prepare a new vicar for us.

Church is not the building or the vicar (although these things are good!), but church is us, the people of God.

So let's be reminded this week about what is important to us as a church, and maybe to seeing growth in the future. Let's meet together to hear teaching from the Bible and to share in communion together, let's invest in friendships and support and care for each other, and let's keep on praying - for our world, for our church, and for each other.

"Jesus, will you renew in me the expectation that you are still the miracle-working, life-shaping, freedom-giving God of Scripture? Show me how to follow you, expecting awe and wonder today." Amen
