St. Matt's Midweek Update - 11th September 2025

I hope you have had a good week.



This term we are going to be looking at prayer in our morning services, and specifically at the Lord's Prayer.

We can find this is Matthew 6:9-13. Jesus says,

"This, then, is how you should pray:

'Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name,

your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.

Give us today our daily bread.

And forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors.

And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from the evil one."

This is such a familiar prayer to most of us, but it is so important as it shows us God's will and His heart for what He wants us to be praying for.

Over this term we will break down the prayer into lines and focus on what each part can teach us about prayer and about our relationship with God.

Ultimately, prayer is all about being in relationship with our Father in heaven and learning to communicate with Him and get to know Him more. We don't just want to know about God; we want to know God and we do that by listening to Him and talking to Him.

Paul says in Philippians 3, "I want to know Christ...". Let's make that our goal as we meet together each week and as we strive to learn how to pray better.
