St. Matt's Midweek Update - 4th September 2025

I hope you are having a good week.



Over the summer we have been looking at the "I am" sayings of Jesus.

In the Old Testament, we see God refer to himself as "I Am" or Yahweh.

In Exodus 3, Moses asks God what he should say to the Israelites when they ask who God is and what his name is. God's reply is, "I am who I am".

So when Jesus uses the phrase "I am" throughout John's gospel, it is more than him just saying what he is like. It is also him telling us that He is God, He is Yahweh, and then showing us what that looks like.

So what does Jesus show us through these "I am" sayings?

I am the bread of life - Jesus can sustain us and provide for us.

I am the light of the world - Jesus brings spiritual light into our human darkness.

I am the gate and the Good Shepherd - Jesus know us, speaks to us and guides us, into his flock and out of things that hem us in.

I am the resurrection and the life - Jesus gives us eternal life and resurrection by conquering death.

I am the way, the truth and the life - believing in Jesus is the only way to God and to being in relationship with Him, and Jesus shows us the truth of God.

I am the true vine - Jesus is the source of all life and we need to stay connected to him.

This Sunday we are going to be looking at one last "I am" saying that comes in Revelation. God says "I am the Alpha and the Omega, who is, and who was, and who is to come."
