St. Matt's Midweek Update - 21st November 2025

I hope you have had a good week and are managing to keep warm!



When I came back from New Wine this year, I told myself I was going to try and read the Bible in a year. I found a plan on my Bible app and got started, and amazingly I am still on track!

However, I am only up to 1 Samuel at the moment and I find the Old Testament quite hard work at times!

There are a lot of rules and regulations for the Israelites, there's quite a lot of description of the temple, and lists of who is in the tribes of Israel. Then there is a lot of attacking other nations to gain the land God promised them. And there are so many examples of the Israelites getting things wrong, turning away from God, not trusting in Him and going their own way.

But what you see time and time again in the Old Testament, is God forgiving the people and showing them grace when they get it wrong and make the same mistakes. He doesn't give up on them and He tries to teach them and discipline them as they turn back to Him each time.

We can sometimes struggle to understand parts of the Old Testament, or to work out how the God of the Old Testament is the same God of the New Testament.

But if we look carefully, we see that God doesn't change. The God of the Old Testament is "ready to forgive, gracious and merciful, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love..."

Nehemiah 9:17

And in The New Testament we see Jesus, God in human form, showing that love, grace, forgiveness and mercy to people through His life, and ultimately through His death.

So however many times we mess up and go our own way, however much we try to have control over our lives instead of letting God lead us, we can trust in the fact that God will never give up on us, and will always be there when we turn back to Him. That is the hope we have in Jesus.
