## St. Matt's Midweek Update - 19th December 2025

I hope you have had a good week and are enjoying the run up to Christmas!



This week Mark has kindly written a reflection for us...

The people walking in darkness have seen a great light; on those living in the land of deep darkness a light has dawned. **Isaiah 9 v2** 

These verses are so often read at our Christmas Services and this Sunday is our Carol Service which falls on 21<sup>st</sup> December – the shortest and darkest day of the year.

Isaiah describes the land Jesus was born into as one of DEEP darkness, a world that he refers at the end of the previous chapter, as one which people look on with distress and fearful gloom.

You may never have experienced deep darkness (unless you live miles away from a town or have a cellar), however as Lisa Riley her recent Bushtucker trial on I'm a Celebrity can confirm, it is a terrifying and unpleasant experience.

What enormously helps us get through this time of year is the millions of tiny lights people put up inside and outside their homes which take our focus off the darkness and onto the light.

The deep darkness Isaiah is referring to is not the darkness of night, but the darkness of life; the lack of love, kindness, and hope, where dark deeds of violence, cruelty, greed, and injustice occur daily across the world.

But into this deep darkness Isaiah says a light has dawned. Just one light – a small child (one single small bulb), that would ultimately bring light in the form of love to every corner of the deep darkness of this world.

This Sunday we will light the 4<sup>th</sup> Advent Candle which signifies God's endless love for us. A love that is seen through the birth, life, death and resurrection of his Son the Lord Jesus Christ.

You may be feeling deep darkness in your life right now, and the joy of Christmas may seem impossible to grasp, however please do try to come along (or listen online) to one of our Christmas services.

Whilst joy may feel difficult to find right now, being reminded of God's deep love for you through Jesus may allow a light to dawn in your heart and guide you into 2026.
